Our speaker, Eric Decker, P.E, CPD, will discuss hydronic expansion in closed-loop systems and how to accommodate it with expansion tanks. Various types of expansion tanks will be reviewed as well as how to properly size them. Air Elimination and Air Containment

methods will also be discussed and how the type of expansion tank affects this choice.)
